## Local samaritan shows "what WE can do!"



Ron Dale, a member of the Ladysmith community, recently shared an emotional account of his experience regarding the local tsunami relief efforts in 2011.

"While I was singing a hymn at the First United Church the question was asked, "What can I do?" I was struck with a wonderful idea.

"I am so proud of the cooperation and community outreach done by the Ladysmith & District Credit Union...

A committee was formed, their goal to raise funds to donate to a community affected by the March 11, 2011 tsunami in the Sendai region of Japan."

This inspirational goal was supported by many people in the community and resulted in \$4,100.00 being donated directly to the Masuda Elementary School, Japan.

"Not only did LDCU collect and secure the funds", recalled Mr. Dale, "they sent them electronically to the school and generously sent a variety of gifts (upwards of 100 items) to distribute to students. The LDCU sea otter, "Ollie", was a wonderfully popular item. Two "Ollies" in particular were given to two young girls, one of which was relocated from another school due to the tsunami devastation. The second girl is a gifted pianist who accompanied the three grade 6 classes


